Students' progress in the program provided they meet the following requirements:

1. Achieves a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 for Regular students prior to enrollment in the Nursing Foundations course or achieves cumulative grade point average of 2.00 for LPN to RN students prior to enrollment in the Nursing Access course; achieves a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 at the end of each subsequent semester.
2. Regular students- Obtains a C [a 2.00 quality point score per Bowling Green State University (BGSU) Firelands College] or higher in all required science courses (Anatomy and Physiology I, Anatomy and Physiology II, Concepts in Biology, General Psychology, Lifespan Development Psychology, and Nutrition) prior to progression to the Nursing Foundations course. Obtains a grade of C in Microbiology (a 2.00 quality point score per BGSU Firelands College) prior to taking Medical Surgical Nursing.
3. LPN to RN students- Obtains a C (a 2.00 quality point score per BGSU Firelands College) or higher in Nursing Access, Basic Anatomy & Physiology for Allied Health, and Microbiology for Healthcare Professionals prior to taking Medical Surgical Nursing; General Psychology prior to taking Psychiatric Nursing; and Lifespan Development Psychology prior to Maternal Child Nursing. Nursing Access may only be taken once.
4. Obtains a final rating of satisfactory in the clinical portion of all nursing courses.
5. Complies with all school regulations. Violations of policies contained in the Student Handbook may result in consequences up to and including dismissal from the program.
6. Achieves a final course average (quizzes, unit tests, final examination) of at least a 77% in each nursing course.
7. A 90% proficiency in dosage calculations is required in all clinical nursing courses. Three opportunities to achieve the 90% will be available. The student is encouraged to utilize dosage calculation learning resources before repeating the quiz. The next two opportunities are on the student's own time. An average of all attempts will be recorded as a quiz grade for the course. Three unsuccessful individual attempts to achieve a 90% will result in failure of the nursing course.
8. National achievement test scores may be included as a part of course grades. Students will be informed of the weight of national achievement test scores in course orientation documents.
9. Nursing courses in the curriculum have prerequisites. Failure of a prerequisite course makes a student ineligible to continue in the next nursing course in the program.
